Options available to reduce the speed of traffic on Main Street, Newburgh, by means of speed controls or a reduction in speed limit, 2. The options available for the stretches of Main Street both within and out with the village centre, 3. Information from Police Scotland regarding enforcement actions available for any possible measures to be taken, 4. Consideration of whether Newburgh could be considered a trial village for a 20mph zone on Main Street, and 5. Confirmation of where speed monitoring has been carried out to date, in order to assess whether this has been an appropriate location.
