

## REPORT TO COMMUNITIES COMMITTEE – 3<sup>rd</sup> JUNE 2021

### DEVELOPING THE NHS GRAMPAN STRATEGIC PLAN (2022-2028)

#### 1 Reason for Report / Summary

- 1.1 On Friday 16th April 2021 NHS Grampian hosted a 'launch event' with invited partners from other public sector organisations to start the development of the next NHS Grampian Strategic Plan.

This report is being presented to the Committee at the very start of the planning process to seek support from the inception point.

Key to the success of the plan will be its development in partnership with other organisations ensuring as much cohesion between organisations as possible. To be very clear, this is NHS Grampian opening its arms to partners to help shape our plan (it is not NHS Grampian trying to tell anyone else how to do their business). We hope to achieve a high level of cohesion between organisations that all support the improvement of population health.

There will be a short presentation at the Communities Committee setting out the timeline and approach to the development of the plan with the aim of getting the support of Aberdeenshire Council's Communities Committee.

#### 2 Recommendations

**The Committee is recommended to:**

- 2.1 Agree to support the development of the NHS Grampian Strategic Plan (2022-28), drawing on the expertise of the Committee (and the wider Council, where appropriate) to help make the plan have an impact on the health of the Aberdeenshire and Grampian population (s).

#### 3 Purpose and Decision Making Route

- 3.1 It is hoped that the Communities Committee will support the development of the NHS Grampian Strategic Plan, therefore, further enhancing the partnership working between the Council and the NHS.

NHS Colleagues will also be working with the Aberdeenshire IJB. The opportunity to work with the Communities Committee will ensure that wider critical aspects of health and wellbeing, such as housing and leisure services, are part of the 'joined up' work.

At the Committee meeting the presentation will set out the timeline for engagement with partners, communities and staff.

## **4 Discussion**

- 4.1 The development of the NHS Strategic Plan offers great opportunity for a cohesive approach to population health to be developed, in partnership, across many organisations and with co-production with our population.

It might be considered that the approach is trying to replicate the Community Planning Partnership remit. Rather than replicate this, NHS Grampian is hoping to use the CPP infrastructure and the expertise and reach of partners within the CPP to create a robust and ambitious plan. Beyond the CPP approach, which is aligned to local authority area, NHS Grampian is hoping to build some cohesion in its plan which would reflect the three CPPs that exist within the Northeast area.

## **5 Council Priorities, Implications and Risk**

- 5.1 The development of the plan will be based on significant engagement and co-creation with the public, partners and staff. To this end we will hear the voice of many groups and develop a plan which is equalities sensitive. The plan will have a formal equalities assessment completed once it is developed.

## **6 Scheme of Governance**

- 6.1 The Head of Finance and Monitoring Officer within Business Services have been consulted in the preparation of this report and had no comments to make and are satisfied that the report complies with the Scheme of Governance and relevant legislation.
