From mountain to sea

Background and purpose of wider review

- All processes require monitoring & review
- The Planning (Scotland) Act 2019 has made a number of changes to both the process of Development Planning and Development Management.
- The cost of delivering the 49 additional duties contained in the new Act are estimated at between £7M and £59M per authority over a 10 year period.
- National requirement for an additional 730 planners in the next 10 years (replacement and expansion) against low graduate rate (35 per annum)
- Continued focus on performance, continuous improvement and efficiency





Changes focused on:

- Balance efficient resource use with ensuring delegations are proportionate and retain Elected Member decision making on more significant applications
- Improve & maintain Performance in decision making timescales
- Greater confidence and certainty and clarity for stakeholders in the handling of applications
- Achieving best value as part of the decision-making process
- Provide clarity on aspects of the Delegations through guidance

























Average times for decisions 2020/21 including and excluding Processing Agreements (PPA)







- Approvals Option 3 (3.2.8)
- Retain the Local Member Notification process for applications recommended for approval with objections
- Increase the number of representations required for direct committee referral criteria for applications with objections to 10
- Refusals Option 3 (3.3.4)
- Delegation of all refusals to Officers subject to other criteria
- This will address current issues caused by referral of refusals whilst retaining oversight of applications recommended for approval subject to objections

Local Member Notification Process – Conflicts of interest and non responses

- Existing process treats a declaration of interest or a non-response as an acceptance from that member to allow delegation of that application.
- Amendment could be introduced so a conflict of interest/non effectively discounts that member from ward. 50% of remaining member/s would require to trigger a referral. Could also be applied to non responses

Local Member Notification Process – Effects of a change

- Changing the process for conflicts of interest only would have minimal impact on overall referrals to Area Committee.
- Effects of counting non-responses in a similar manner vary depending on adoption of the recommendations. Simplified process could also be introduced but greater impact.

Retain existing referral criteria (Option 1)	No additional effect expected	+23 (+15%) additional applications referred to Committee	+53 (+30%) additional applications referred to Committee
Remove Local Member Notification entirely (Option 2)	Not applicable	Not applicable	Not applicable
Delegate Refusals but retain process for applications recommended for approval with letters of objection (Option 3 – Recommended)	Overall reduction of circa 60 applications	+8 applications for approval referred to Committee (overall reduction of 52)	+22 applications for approval referred to Committee (overall reduction of 38)



From mountain to sea

Representations: The counting of multiple representations (3.5.1-3.5.8)

- All valid representations and material planning considerations are considered as part of the planning process.
- Currently valid representations of the same nature from same household are considered collectively for the purposes of the criteria for direct Committee referral. eg - 5 responses in objection from one household = 1 representation*
- Concern that changing to count all representations for purposes of Planning Delegations would be open to individual households dictating route of determination.
- If a change is sought then recommended that the threshold for a direct committee referral is increased.

^{*} All valid planning issues are taken into consideration
