MPI – Speeding on Fintray Road, Blackburn	19/08/2021	<p>Look at a more holistic way for dealing with speeding in Aberdeenshire Communities.</p> <p>Ask the Director to look at the budget implications for purchasing additional stocks of SIDs and to come up with recommendations for how the devices could be used, rotating to locations to address speeding in specific areas when required.</p> <p>Ask the Director to speak to Police Scotland and bring back a report to Committee which has explored what they can do and their capacity to deal with tackling speeding in Aberdeenshire communities to inform Council policy.</p>		<p>The Director has written to Chief Superintendent George MacDonald who has replied positively.</p> <p>The letter expressed the Committee's wish to hear directly from Police Scotland given the strategic and policy role around Road Casualty Reduction that sits with this Committee.</p> <p>A verbal update will be provided following a telephone meeting between the Director and the Chief Superintendent.</p>

Urban Gulls Update	30/09/2021	The Committee looked forward to a report being presented to Committee in January 2022, acknowledging that there must be two-way communication with all MSPs in the NE and as many people as possible engaged with the review.		The review of the Council's response to dealing with Urban Gulls is currently taking place. A short-term working group has been established and is currently reviewing the options for responding to communities' concerns regarding urban gulls. This group is made up of officers from within Services across the Council, officers from Aberdeen City and Moray, Nature Scotland, RSPB and pest control firms. Contact has also been made with Aberdeen University to explore opportunities for carrying out research across the Northeast in order that any strategies developed are as effective as possible. A number of MSPs enquiries have been responded to and there is a commitment to share the outcome of the review with them following the Report to Committee in January 2022.
