NAMING OF NEW STREET IN NEW ABERDOUR

1 Executive Summary/Recommendation

1.1 The purpose of this report is to seek Committee approval to name one new street in the village of New Aberdour, in accordance with the Council's Roads Policy on Street Naming and Property Numbering.

1.2 The Committee is recommended to:

1.2.1 Consider and agree the use of the street name Sutherland.

2 Decision-Making Route

2.1 Due to a small new development in New Aberdour there is a requirement for one new street to be named. New Aberdour, Tyrie & Pennan Community Council were consulted on proposed names and recommend Sutherland for use.

2.2 This matter has now come before the Committee for consideration. Sutherland refers to a specific individual from the area. The Council's Roads Policy on Street Naming and Property Numbering dictates approval must be sought from the local Area Committee if any proposed street names refer to or celebrate a specific individual where that individual is living or has passed away in the last 100 years.

3 Discussion

3.1 Mr Harry Sutherland, to whom the proposed name refers, was a local man. He is said to have lived in New Aberdour all his life and was known around the village. Several local community projects were named in Mr Sutherland's will.

3.2 New Aberdour, Tyrie & Pennan Community Council believe it is a fitting tribute to name a local street in his memory.

3.3 The Council's Roads Policy on Street Naming and Property Numbering states best practice is that street name prefixes should now be used only once in a development.

3.4 Please note this consultation is for the prefix part of street names only and that the suffix of the street name (e.g. Road, Street etc.) will be determined in consultation with the Council's Roads Policy on Street Naming and Property Numbering.

4 Council Priorities, Implications and Risk

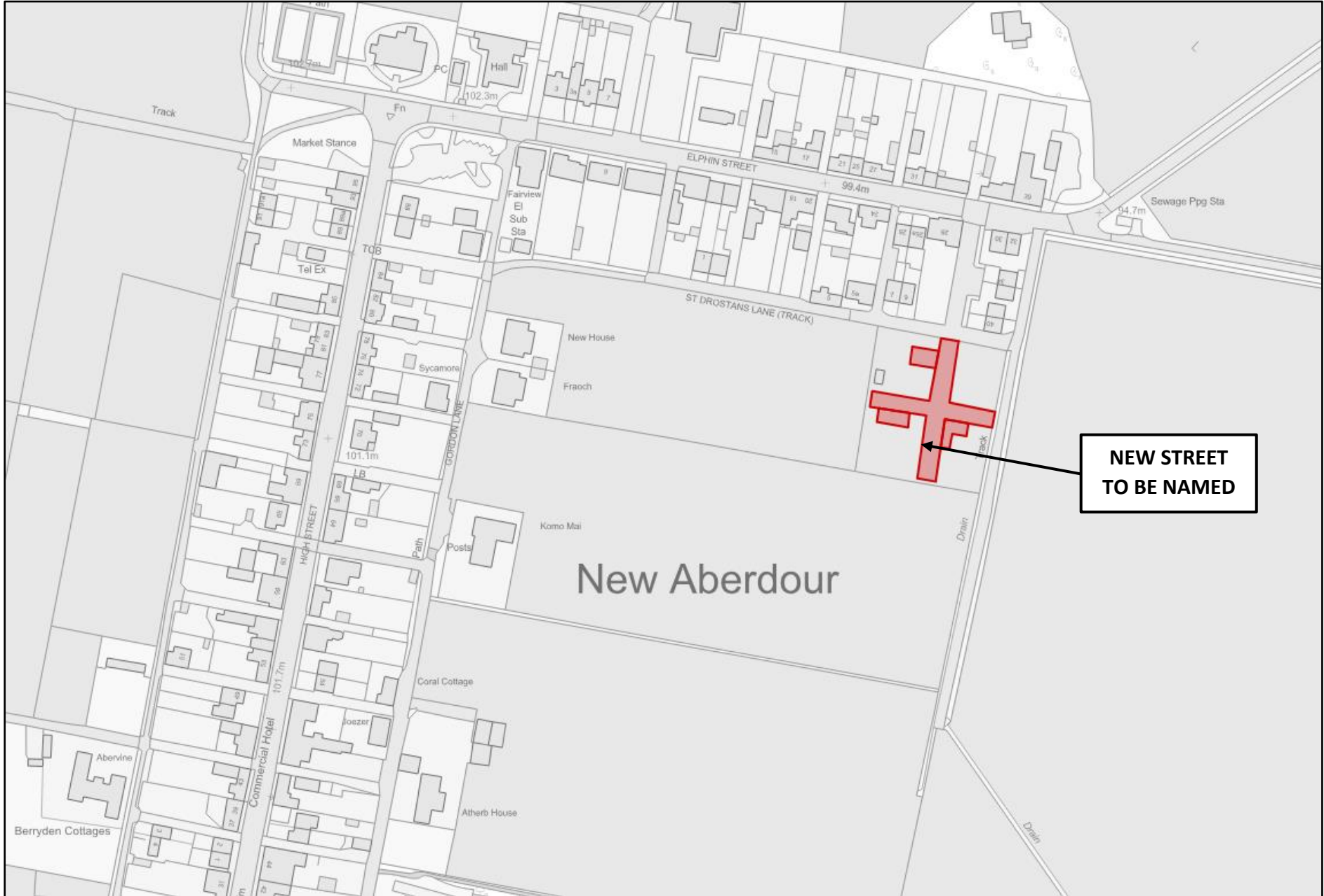
